



Outdoor Burning in the City of Ashland

Prior to burning within Ashland city limits, the following actions are required each day:

- call **541-776-7007** to confirm it is a burn day
- complete the burn permit form online at **ashlandoregon.gov/BurnPermits**

When can I burn?

- March 1st until summer fire season is declared
- End of fire season through October 31st
- During daylight hours only
- Materials are too far from access point to haul.

What can be burned?

- Native vegetation only for wildfire fuels reduction
- Noxious weeds on Oregon Department of Agriculture list

How can I burn?

- Make small piles at least 50 feet from any structure, maximum 4 feet in diameter, 3 feet tall
- Clear the ground 10 feet around the fire
- Keep a water source and shovel near the fire
- Never leave a fire unattended
- Keep pile covered and dry until ready to burn

When can't I burn?

- During the declared summer fire season
- November through February, per air quality regulations
- At night

What can't be burned?

- Garbage
- Petroleum products
- Construction debris
- Any material which emits dense smoke or noxious odors.
- Leaves & Grass
