

Approved Herbicides in Stream Bank and Wetland Protection Zones

Glyphosate with no surfactants

Brand names: *Rodeo®*, *Glyfos Aquatic®*, *Accord® Concentrate*, *AquaMaster TM*
(surfactants have specifically been left out of these formulations)

Note: A number of Glyphosate formulations are marketed as safe for aquatic areas, yet contain surfactants (see prohibited list). The surfactant itself is much more toxic than Glyphosate to aquatic organisms. The inclusion, or addition, of any surfactant to the Glyphosate formulation is not permitted. A certified professional applicator must apply the Glyphosate directly and ensure absolutely no surfactants are present in the formulation.

Prohibited Herbicides in Stream Bank and Wetland Protection Zones

Although the following herbicides are commonly marketed for use in riparian or wetland areas, they are not approved for use in Stream Bank Protection Zones or Wetland Protection Zones within the City of Ashland.

Brand names may be also differ from those listed. **Only herbicides specifically listed within the “Approved Herbicides” listing are allowed in Ashland’s water resource protection zones.**
